**W**e welcome you to take part in our fourth annual Chuck Wagon Cook-Off & Heritage Gathering in Boerne, TX. We are accepting only 20 wagons this year, so don't wait too long! There is a \$100 entry fee that will be refunded upon your arrival. Wagon judging and a sponsor/cooks party will take place on Friday, March 6th with food judging, a heritage gathering, and feeding the public on Saturday, March 7th.

The cook-off event will benefit the Agricultural Heritage Museum, a non-profit organization located at the corner of Hwy 46 and City Park Road. The Agricultural Heritage Museum has a collection of antique farming equipment and artifacts, a working blacksmith shop, wood shop, pioneer house, smoke house, tractor barn, and wagenhaus — all on over 5 acres overlooking Cibolo Creek.

## Food:

- There will be a total of 15 food judges (3 per category). Judging will take place at each wagon.
- Provisions: Each wagon will prepare for 40 ticket holders so portion your food accordingly. **Each wagon will be furnished** 20 lb meat for chicken fried steak, 6 lb beans, 20 lb. flour, 4 lb, sugar, 1 gal. milk, 15 lbs, potatoes, onions, a dozen eggs, 2 lb. butter, 1 gal cooking oil, ice and drinking water, 3 lbs canned peaches.
- Each wagon will need to furnish their own cooking wood
- A water hose will be available for cooking and cleanup water.
- Pan liners (Inserts) **are not allowed.**
- Please do not use boxed or prepared mixes, commercial sauces, frozen foods, mayonnaise or mushrooms.
- Please bring your food thermometer and bleach.
- All cooking must be done over wood fires and contained within wind protectors with metal siding due to the possibility of a fire ban on the date of the event. Propane burners will only be allowed for cleaning.
- A designated head cook and up to three others shall comprise the official crew of your wagon. These persons only may be in camp and involved in the preparation & cooking until after food samples are turned in.
- **NO DOGS** will be allowed in camp for health reasons.

## Wagon Judging:

- Wagons will be judged using trail wagon criteria.
- Wagon authenticity will be judged on the following: Sound and driveable condition, brake system, spring seat, 4-5 wooden bows, wagon sheet, old-style chuck box (no plywood, or dry wall screws), 30 or 50 gallon water barrel, mounted coffee grinder, wooden tongue, double tree and single trees, wheel wrench, stay chains, harness, old kerosene lantern, shovel and axe; appearance of camp, hospitality, dress of cooks.

## Prize Money & Awards: Total Payout over \$10,000.00

Every wagon will receive **\$250.00 show up money** for participating. \$150 for traveling the farthest.

**Prize money as follows:** \$250 1st place, \$200 2nd place, \$150 third place, \$100 4th place, \$50 5th place in each category: Wagon, Beans, Bread, Dessert, Meat, Potatoes. 1st places in each category will receive a plaque.

**Overall winners:** \$300 1st place, \$250 2nd place, \$200 3rd place, \$150 4th place, \$100 5th place. Judging is based 60% on food and 40% on wagon.
